THE COLLEGE COLLECTS FEEDBACK FROM STUDENTS ON HER TEACHING-LEARNING MECHANISM FROM ALL HER STAKEHOLDERS, DULY ANALYSES IT AND TAKES COMMENSURATE ACTION AS PER THE GIVEN FEEDBACK:

FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT 2022

1. Institutional feedback of students: The students have given good response on teaching-learning segment. They have shared positive responses on – (a) Easy comprehension (b) completion of syllabus (c) fairness in evaluation (d) library facilities (e) computer facility. However, a bit more attention should be given to areas like (a) sports facilities (b) vending facility (c) hostel facilities (d) campus cleanliness.
2. Faculty feedback: The faculties of the college have given positive feedback about the Central library as a major source of information; the library is used optimally both by students and faculty. As far as the departmental feedback is concerned, the teachers are encouraged to carry out research, to organize seminar/ workshop/ symposia. However, more steps should be taken to develop the teaching aids which could provide adequate learning resources for the teachers; encouragement should be given to undertake extension and service-related programs. Classes are conducted as per schedule, the central library offers an impressive repository of books and journals and, the adjoining e-resource room, furnished with 21 computers, offers students ample scope for accessing the internet and carrying on research at their leisure time. As far as College infrastructure is concerned, a satisfactory result has been obtained with regard to equipments of laboratories, water resources, and safe drinking water. However, maintenance and proper cleaning of toilets were dissatisfactory, maintenance of building, furniture and sports infrastructure too failed to impress the stakeholders. Accessibility, transparency and a forum to express opinions would be much appreciated if introduced within the mechanism of teaching, learning, evaluation and administration.

3. Supporting staff feedback: The Supporting staff have showered praise on the entire mechanism of security and safety of women employees at the workplace; the work distribution among all non-teaching faculty, is fair with employees having reasonable work load. They feel benefitted by the training programmes organized by the college. However, they requested for a bit more flexibility in their work schedule for the benefit of the college.
4. Feedback from management: The management has praised such practices like regular GB meetings, circulation of notices. However, the college can be more benefitted if the results are placed before GB for analysis.
5. Alumni: The alumni is happy with the various activities for students' development, the judicious way the college handles students' grievances and the process of integrating the alumni with the college through mails and messages. However, they want the institution to focus a bit more on campus and off campus placement opportunities.
6. Parental Satisfaction: The parents are satisfied with the teaching-learning environment as offered by the college; competence and commitment of the faculty, the learning resources like library, internet, computer, other support services like bank, canteen, career counselling have impressed the guardians. However, the guardians have asked for provision of career-oriented courses, monitoring of students' progress and sessions to facilitate enhancement in students' personality.

The College has an enviable Mentor/Mentee ratio, as evident from the data stated hereunder; mentoring is dutifully done by most faculties as a remedial measure for slow learners who often find it difficult to comprehend class lectures fully:

The purpose of this Agreement is to develop academic and educational collaboration through resource sharing, seminars, talks and teachers/students exchange between the two institutions for strengthening professional relations.

Both the institutions undertake to promote and develop cooperation with various activities since 2022-2023 and those listed below:

FULLY AUTOMATED LIBRARY WITH ILMS, TO CATER TO THE EVER CHANGING AND CLASSIFIED NEEDS OF STUDENTS:

Vidyasagar College for Women Library is the most important information centre of our institution. Presently library has two wings - Main library, Seminar Library - they are situated in ground floor of the new college building and 'Seminar Library', located on the second floor of 'Old Building'. It houses more than twenty seven thousand books without e-books and e-journals, newspapers, printed documents, electronic materials etc. Our library follows 'Open access' arrangement for all books, including reference books. Our library functions are fully automated through the open source Library management software 'KOHA' (version- 19.05.07.000). Our main library also contained e-zone separately along with 21 computers. Users can access our library collections through OPAC / WEB-OPAC under wi-fi environment. Library circulation system is running under 'Bar Code' based management system along with manual procedure in circulation desk. 'Seminar library' comprises of 21 no of computers for internet surfing and consultation of electronic and digital documents. Users are enjoying 'Internet Surfing', computer printout, photocopies and 'Downloading facility in this library. Online resources through N-LIST of INFLIBNET are also available in our college. Printing and photocopying service are provided to the users. VCFW Library has developed the 'Institutional Repository (IR)' initiation with Questions Databank. Very recently, VCFW Library takes initiative with QR Code technology for Library Web OPAC and online digital content.

Also, new IT equipment has been purchased as per the requirements. Overall in every year, our computer laboratories were upgraded or new laboratories set up for new requirements. - Sweepers-cum-Cleaners are appointed for the regular cleaning of the campus. All toilet blocks are cleaned twice a day.

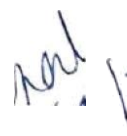

Gender Cell of Vidyasagar College for Women organised a webinar on “Myths to Market: Images of Women and Gender Politics” on March 14, 2022 at 11 am. Dr. Pankaj K. Singh, former Professor and Chairperson of the Department of English, Himachal Pradesh University, discussed how gender is seen as pervading the realm of politics in that it reflects the distribution of power and reinforces notions of masculinity and femininity.

She focused on the ways in which gender dynamics operate in the family, the labour market, and the polity — that explain why women have been historically marginalized.

Gender is not just personal identity; it is social identity. It arises from our relationships to other people, and it depends upon social interaction and social recognition. As such, Dr. Singh highlighted that it influences how we understand ourselves in relation to others.

The politics of gender examines how society influences our understandings and perception of differences between “masculinity” (what society deems appropriate behaviour for a “man”) and “femininity” (what society deems appropriate behaviour for a “woman”). Dr. Singh examined how this, in turn, influences identity and social practices. She gave special emphasis on the power relationships that follow from the established gender order in a given society, as well as how this changes over time. The speaker highlighted, gender is an act, gender is not a state of being, citing suitable incidents from *The Ramayana*, *The Mahabharata*, Indian myths and folklores. Finally, she discussed stereotyped representations of women in modern media and advertisement and how women need to think beyond such stereotypes.

DISABLED-FRIENDLY CAMPUS

The new building of our College (8A Sibnarayan Das lane, Kolkata-700006) has been constructed keeping in view specific needs of Divyangans/ Specially-abled students. To facilitate smoother movement in the College campus, a lift has been installed with a ramp leading to the lift. The College also has a wheelchair for the benefit of those with restricted movements.

Inclusion is an effort to make sure that diverse learners – those with physical disabilities, different languages and cultures, different homes and family backgrounds, different interests and ways of learning – irrespective of their strengths and weaknesses will be part of mainstream education. A good inclusive education, which our institution practices is one that allows all the students to participate in all aspects of curricular and extra curricular activities every year. During 2021-2022 Inter College competition including cultural programmes to celebrate Vidyasagar Birth Anniversary was successfully organized. International Mother Language Day, Yoga Day, Womens' Day, Teachers' Day, Hindi Divas, Annual Sports, College Social, Freshers Welcome, Farewell programmes are organized every year to promote unity in diversity.

We at Vidyasagar College for Women, believe in this credo of Unity in Diversity. That is why our students respect the difference and uniqueness of religions, languages and cultures.

Dr. Sobha Chattopadhyay, former Professor, Department of English, Jadavpur University was invited as a Resource Person for this webinar. We have a library equipped with INFLIBNET and computer facilities. There is a Career Counseling and a Personal Counseling Cell. Computer course is offered by WEBEL.

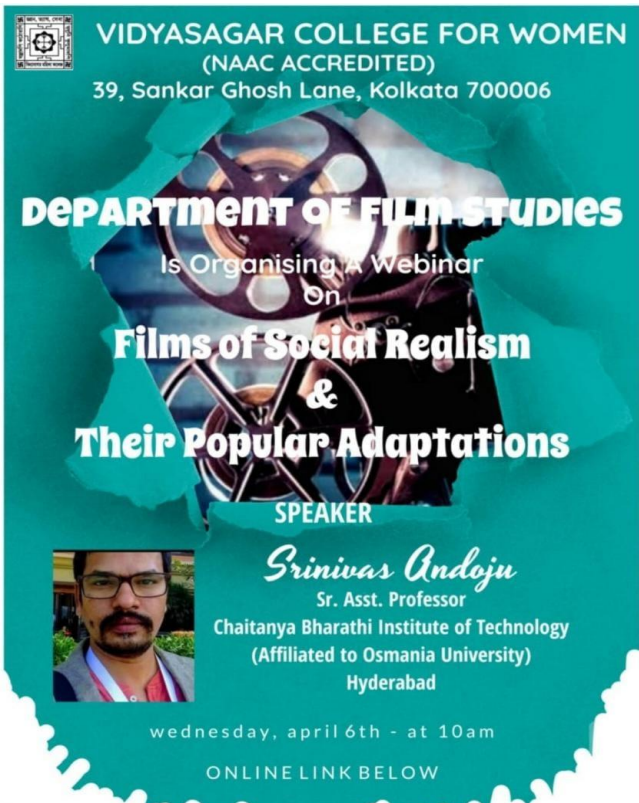
