Brief History

Vidyasagar College for Women, as a full fledged separate college affiliated to the University of Calcutta, was founded in 1960. However, its history goes back to 1931 when a separate women's section of the Vidyasagar College was started to cater to the educational requirements of the young women of Kolkata. Its classes were held in the morning. The women's section was temporarily brought to a stop during the Second World War. Since 1947, however, expansion in all branches of its activities took place steadily and regularly. New subjects were introduced and a group of dedicated teachers inspired confidence among the students who enrolled in large numbers. Since its foundation in 1960, Vidyasagar College for Women has committed itself to carry forward the ideals and principles of Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar, the great educationist and social reformer of the 19th century. At present the college consists of three campuses.

The college has been reaccredited by NAAC in 2017

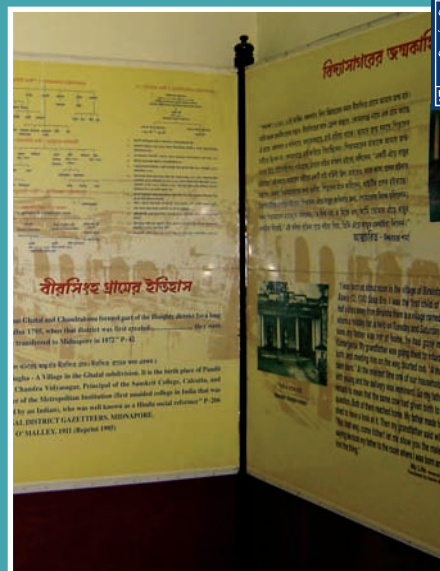

Subjects and Combination

Courses Offered : The college offers Semester-wise Three year B.A. / B.Sc. (Honours and General) courses of studies under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) a list of which along with the subject combinations permitted by the college is given below. Following points are to be noted:

- For each Honours course, two Generic Elective (GE) subjects have to be taken as subject combination.
- For each General course, Two Core Course (CC) and one Generic Elective (GE) subjects have to be taken as subject combination.
- **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)** are compulsory for all disciplines. This course consists of two courses

i) AECC1: Communicative English / MIL (Bengali/Hindi)

ii) AECC2: Environmental Studies.

Admission Procedure for the Session 2019 – 2020

1. The College offers Semester-wise Three year B.A., B.Sc. (both Honours and General) Courses of Studies under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) under the affiliation of the University of Calcutta. Hereafter, the above two streams will be abbreviated as B.A (Bachelor of Arts) and B.Sc. (Bachelor of Science) respectively.

Application for admission to B.A/B.Sc. courses for the session 2019-2020 shall be through online mode only through the website (<http://vcfwadmission.com>) commencing after the publication of 10+2 results by W.B.C.H.S.E, ISC, CBSE board and shall continue for the stipulated days following the guidelines of the University of Calcutta. Precise Admission-schedule of the college shall be notified in due course on the college website <http://www.vcfw.org>.

Note: No printed application form will be issued from the college. Applications will be considered only upon the payment of the requisite Application Fees (Rs. 300/-) within the stipulated date. Payments can be made through online using *Net Banking facility, Credit or Debit Card* of any bank OR Cash payment at any branch of Punjab National Bank (PNB). *The requisite application fee is exclusive of Bank charges for their service.*

- The academic session 2019-2020 shall commence within 1st week of July, 2019.
- All admissions shall be guided by the relevant guidelines of the University of Calcutta (www.caluniv.ac.in).

2. Duration of the Program:

The 3 year B.A./ B.Sc. (Honours/General) Programme shall be for a minimum duration of six (6) consecutive semesters of six (6) months each, i.e., three (3) years. The odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year.

A candidate pursuing a regular course of study for three-year semester-wise degree course shall have to clear all the semesters in all respects within a span of five years from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which enrolment of the candidate shall stand cancelled.

3. Admission Rule

a) A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the 3 year (six semesters) B.A./B.Sc./B.Mus. (Honours/General) Course of Studies provided he/she has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions mentioned below.

Candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Vocational examination conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the B.A. (General) 1st year Course of Studies taking the subjects under Humanities



Division only. However, no candidate shall be allowed admission after a lapse of more than 5 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating five years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination. For example, if a candidate pass 10+2 examination in 2014, she will also be eligible for applying in 2019 for the session 2019-2020.

b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit Migration Certificate for getting Registration under University of Calcutta.

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./B.Sc. (Honours/General) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate. Marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject “Environmental Science” is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

4. Eligibility Criteria for Application:

A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:

a) For Honours Degree (General & OBC Category):

50% marks in aggregate with 45% marks in the subject or related subject* at the previous qualifying examination

OR

55% marks in the subject or related subject* at the previous qualifying examination and pass marks in aggregate

OR

50% marks in aggregate in case of the candidate opting Honours in the subject which is not included in her previous qualifying examination.

b) For Honours Degree (SC/ST Category):

40% marks in aggregate

OR

40% marks in the subject and pass marks in aggregate

OR

40% marks in the subject or related subject* at the previous qualifying examination.

c) For General Degree Courses (B.A./B.Sc & for all categories):

Applicant must qualify in H.S. or equivalent examination.

5. A candidate shall be allowed to take up the subject(s) under heading '(A)' if she has passed the subject(s) under heading '(B)' in the previous qualifying examination as elaborated in Table-1 below.

*** B.A. Honours (except Geography) candidates having **Film Studies/Journalism** as a general subject have to pay ₹ 300/- as **Laboratory Charges**, every year, in addition to their scheduled Honours Course Fees tabulated above.

Economics (Hons) students have to pay Rs 400 as Laboratory Charges in the 3rd year.

11. Outline of Choice Based Credit System (All choices are not available in this college)

A) **Core Course (CC)** : A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

• **Modalities of selecting CC by a student of Honours/ General programme shall be as follows :**

- In case of B.A./B.Sc Honours programme a student shall have to study 14 Core courses of the Honours Subject as specified for each of the 6 semesters.
- In case of B.Sc. General Programme a student shall have to study 4 Core Courses of each of the 3 chosen subjects as specified for each of the first 4 Semesters.
- In case of B.A. General programme a student shall have to study 4 Core Courses of each of the 2 chosen subjects as specified for each of the first 4 Semesters. In addition 4 Core Courses to be studied; two courses each from two language subjects: LCC1- English & LCC2- MIL (Bengali/Hindi)/ Alternative English as specified for each of the last 4 semesters.



B) Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

- i) **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** Elective courses which may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. This course is to advance knowledge and skill in the core course domain.

· **Modalities of selecting DSE by a student of Honours/ General programme shall be as follows :**

- a) In case of B.A./B.Sc. Honoursprogramme a student shall have to study 4 DSE courses strictly on the Honours subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of DSE on the Honours subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester.

Explanation: Each Honours subject shall have two groups (A & B) of DSE papers. A student shall choose any one paper from each of Group A and Group B in fifth semester and sixth semester.

- b) In case of B.A. General programme, a student shall have to study 4 DSE courses strictly on 2 subjects, opted for pursuing Core Courses, taking exactly 2 courses from each subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of DSE of the subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester, i.e., DSE-A in the 5 th and DSE-B in 6 th semester.

Explanation : Each General subject shall have two groups (A & B) of DSE papers. A student shall have to choose one paper from Group A of each of the two subjects in the fifth semester and one paper from Group B of each of the two subjects in the sixth semester.

- c) In case of B.Sc. General programme, a student shall have to study 6 DSE courses strictly on 3 subjects, opted for pursuing core courses, taking exactly two courses from each subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of DSE of the subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester, i.e., DSE-A in the 5 th and DSE-B in 6 th semester.

Explanation: Each General subject shall have two groups (A & B) of DSE papers. A student shall have to choose one paper from Group A of each of the three subjects in fifth semester and one paper from Group B of each of the three subjects in sixth semester.

· **Dissertation/Project :** An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, is termed as dissertation/ project. This is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/ analyzing/ exploring a real life situation/ difficult problem. A dissertation/ project work will be of 6 credits. A dissertation/ project work may be given in lieu of a Discipline Specific Elective.

- ii) **Generic Elective (GE) Course :** An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek wide exposure, is called Generic Elective.

· **Modalities of selecting GE by a student of Honours/ General programme shall be as follows :**

- a) In case of B.A./B.Sc. Honoursprogramme, a student shall have to choose 4 Generic Elective papers strictly from 2 subjects of choice taking exactly two courses from each subject as specified for first 4 semesters.

- b) In case of B.A. General programme, a student shall have to choose 2 Generic Elective papers strictly from one particular subject [which will be different from the core subjects including the Core Languages (LCC1 & LCC2)] as specified for the 1st and 2nd semester.



N.B.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective. [A Core Course (CC) of B.A./B.Sc. General may be treated as Generic Elective for B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) and B.A. (General)].

C) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) : The Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).

a) **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) :** AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

- i) AECC1 : Communicative English / MIL (Bengali/Hindi);
- ii) AECC2 : Environmental Studies.

b) **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills, etc.

• **Modalities of selecting SEC by a student of Honours/ General programme shall be as follows :**

a) In case of B.A./B.Sc. Honours programme a student shall have to study 2 skill enhancement courses strictly on the Honours subjects. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of SEC on the Honours subjects concerned as specified for the relevant semester, i.e., SEC-A in the 3rd semester and SEC-B in the 4th semester.

Explanation: Each Honours subject shall have two groups (A & B) of Skill Enhancing Course papers. An Honours student shall have to choose one paper from Group A in third semester and one paper from Group B in fourth semester.

b) In case of B.A. General programme, a student shall have to study 4 Skill Enhancement courses strictly on 2 subjects, opted for pursuing Core Courses, taking exactly 2 courses from each subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of SEC of the subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester.

Explanation : Each General subject shall have two groups (A & B) of SEC papers. A student shall have to choose one paper from Group A of each of the two core subjects in the third and fifth semesters and one paper from Group B of each of the two core subjects in the fourth and the sixth semester.

c) In case of B.Sc General programme, a student shall have to study 4 Skill Enhancement Courses strictly on 2 subjects out of the three, opted for pursuing core courses, taking exactly two courses from each subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of SEC of the subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester.

Explanation : Each General subject shall have two groups (A & B) of SEC papers. One paper from Group A of each of the two Core subjects to be chosen in the third and fifth semester; one paper from Group B of each of the two core subjects to be chosen in the fourth and sixth semester.

Practical/ Tutorial : Every Core, Discipline Specific and Generic Elective Course shall have a Practical/ Tutorial component. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa.

FACILITIES



Class Rooms:

The College has 15 class rooms (in the old building) and 7 class rooms (in the new building). Besides, the College shares 10 class rooms with Vidyasagar Evening College (New Building).

Libraries:

The College has a highly updated computerized library. The Library Hall in the Main Campus consists of the seminar libraries of mainly the ARTS departments having reference books, seven departmental cubicles complete with necessary furnishings, reading and writing materials, and computers with internet connections and reading facilities for both teachers and students. Floor area: 600 sq. ft., Number of books: 1000 (approximately).

Working hours as per College hours:

The Central Library in the New Building boasts of an envious collection of books of all departments and a photocopier cum scanner cum printer. Its main function is to issue and receive books to and from both staff and students. Reading facilities are also available. Floor area: 3000 sq. ft., Number of books is more than 23588.

Working hours : 8 am. to 2 pm.

E-Resource Room:

E-Resource Room, adjacent to the library, offering the students free-browsing experience with internet connectivity, ensures that students are able to utilize their free time between classes, to the optimum qualitatively.

Auditorium:

The College auditorium, in the 2nd floor of the New Building, has been inaugurated on the 9th of May 2016. Complete with all necessary air-conditioning and audio visual arrangements, it is a multipurpose hall which can be used both as auditorium and seminar room. Audience capacity is 100.

Open-Air Stage :

An open-air stage in the precincts of the New Building is nearing completion and is expected to be inaugurated in the next academic session itself.

Computer Lab:

Funded by Hon'ble MLA Smt. Smita Bakshi (Jorasako Assmby) under BEUP Work, the

computer lab is housed in the 2nd floor of the New Building. The section is fully equipped with computers and all necessary equipments and accessories. This Lab is of immense research and other functional potentialities in today's scenario.

IQAC Room:

The IQAC Room, furnished with all latest technological facilities, has been built on the second floor of the New Building. Dr. Tapan Roy, Associate Prof., Dept. of Mathematics, is the Convener of IQAC.

Laboratories:

The College has Laboratories of all Science Depts. in the main building. However, to facilitate longer working hours, Zoology and Botany Laboratories have been built in the ground floor of the New Building.

NSS/NCC Room:

The College has fully functional N.S.S. and N.C.C. units. To facilitate smooth working for these units, the college has a class room for NSS & NCC units in the ground floor of the New Building.

Common Room:

The students' common room in the main campus is about 1000 sq. ft floor area. It is designed to provide our students with short-time indoor games such as TT, Carom Boards etc., newspapers and appropriate magazines and small time get together facilities. It is used by the students for preparing for diverse programs organized and performed in the college.

Union/Association Room:

The college always tries to inculcate larger sense and duties and responsibilities in the students, to encourage them to take part in diverse administrative and academic activities of the college in the best democratic traditions of the present times. The Students' Union, democratically elected from amongst students and duly represented in the College Governing Body and other relevant committees, has been provided with their own Union Room where they hold their meetings and discussions regarding college matters. The Union Room is furnished with all necessary equipments and furnishings.

Health Care:

Health care facilities are available to students in-campus as well as off-campus.

**In Campus (Main Campus) :**

The following facilities are available :

- Periodic health camps and medical checkups by competent physicians.
- Periodic counseling by professional counselors to prepare students to meet individual problems and problems in relation to

domestic and social relations.

Off Campus:

- Students' Health Service and University Health Centre run by the Board of Health of C.U in Goenka Hospital at Muktaram Babu Street, very close to our college offer specialized medical treatments.
- The Students' Health Home offer the following medical treatments to students free of cost on Principal's recommendations at its complex located at 142/2 A.J.C Bose Road (South of Nilratan Sircar Medical College) after one month from their date of admission onwards :
 - Free medical examination and advice at its clinic.
 - Laboratory examination of blood, sputum etc. at Rs. 5/ per sample.
 - Radiological investigation at its X-Ray department
 - All kinds of prescribed medicines and spectacles, if required, provided at subsidized rate.
 - Hospitalization facility in different hospitals of the city.
 - Free medical care and treatment of T.B. affected students in sanatoria. Career Counseling and Placement Cells

Job-oriented Course:

With a view to enable students to take up present day challenges in career, suitably designed Communicative English courses and vocational computer courses are conducted.

Career Counseling and Placement Cells:

The college has a Career Counseling Cell and offers necessary counseling to the students according to their capabilities, orientations and aptitude. The cell has an office in our Second Campus equipped with Psychometric, Aptitude and Personality Test Mechanisms and all necessary technological backup and database to guide our students to chose from a wide ranging career opportunities. This cell functions in tandem with the Placement Cell, which also has its office at the Second Campus. Thanks to these two cells, quite a large number of our students have secured placements in educational institutions, both Govt. and non-Govt. offices, hospitals and clinics etc. A large number of our students have

become professionals.

- Remedial Coaching Classes are arranged for the students of SC, ST & OBC Categories.
